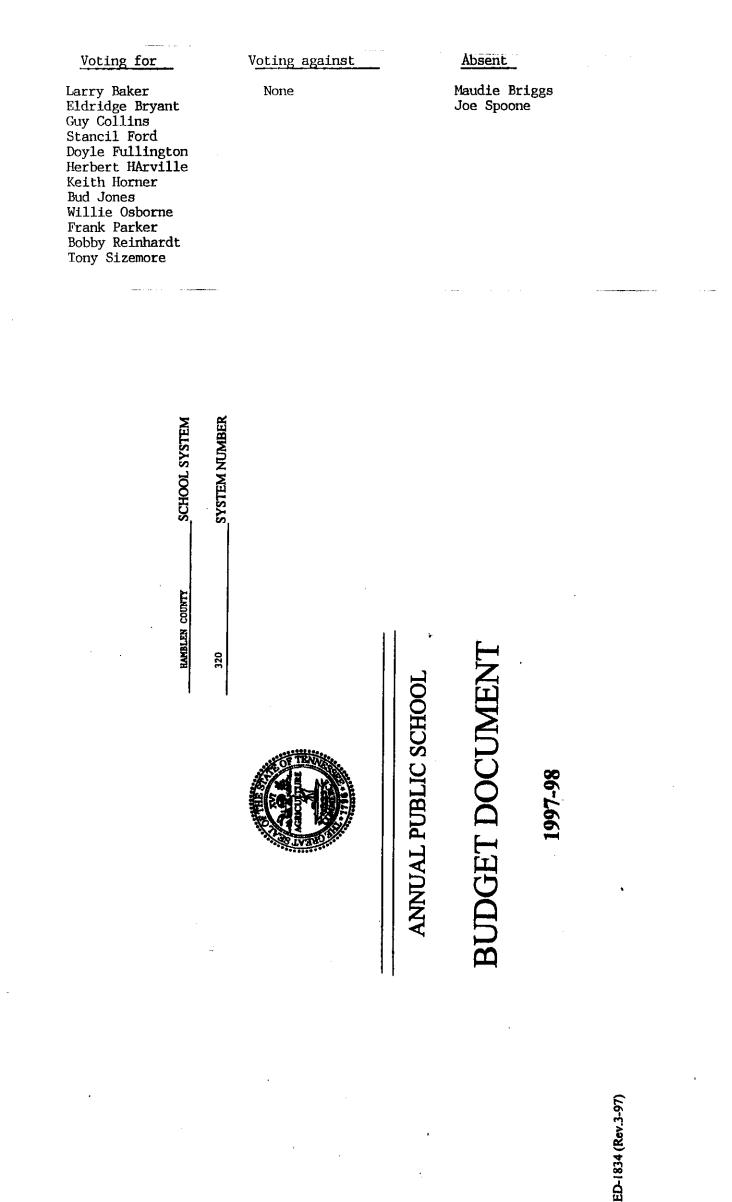

That said funds must only be used by the named non-profit organization in furtherance of their non-profit chartered purposes benefiting the general welfare of the residents of the county.

3. That if it is the expressed interest of the County Commission of

Hamblen County in providing these funds in compliance with Chapter 0390-2-7 of

Tennessee Code Annotated and any and all other laws which may apply to county

appropriations to non-profit organizations and so these appropriations are made

subject to compliance with any and all of these laws and regulations.
