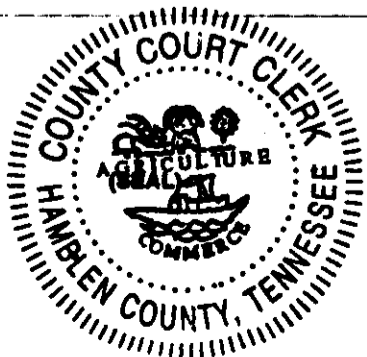


WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Commission understands that this is a unique opportunity to participate in and have influence on CENSUS 2000;



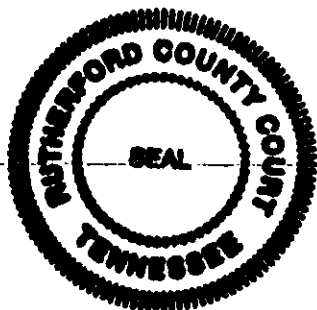

WHEREAS, these monies are subsequently appropriated by the County Legislative Body to programs which benefit ALL citizens of Hamblen County; and


WHEREAS, the General Sessions Court has always served as a basic component of County Government in Hamblen County; and

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT STANDARD CODES

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT VARIOUS STANDARD CODES RELATING TO INSPECTION
ACTIVITIES OF HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE AND ENFORCEMENT
OF BUILDING PROVISIONS AS PROVIDED IN SAID CODES

WHEREAS, it is the desire of Hamblen County, Tennessee to adopt, in all respects, the various Standard Codes relating to amusement devices, building, fire prevention, gas, housing, mechanical, and swimming pools, and

WHEREAS, the adoption of these codes is done to facilitate proper inspection activities by Hamblen County, Tennessee relating to construction and maintenance of buildings within Hamblen County, Tennessee and relating to public safety, health and general welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners that the following codes are hereby adopted by reference as though they were copied herein fully:

Standard Amusement Device Code - 1997 Edition
Standard Building Code - 1997 Edition
Standard Existing Buildings Code - 1997 Edition
Standard Fire Prevention Code - 1997 Edition - sprinkler system for building
Standard Gas Code - 1997 Edition
Standard Housing Code - 1997 Edition - dilapidated housing
Standard Mechanical Code - 1997 Edition
Standard Swimming Pool Code - 1997 Edition
Standard Unsafe Building Abatement Code - 1985 Edition

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY Hamblen County, Tennessee that any matters in said Codes which are contrary to existing Resolutions of Hamblen County, Tennessee shall prevail and, to that extent any existing Resolutions to the contrary are hereby repealed in that respect only.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that within said codes, when reference is made to the duties of a certain official named therein, that designated official of Hamblen County, Tennessee who has duties corresponding to those of the named official in said Code shall be deemed to be the responsible official insofar as enforcing the provisions of said Code are concerned.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

RECOMMENDED SCHEDULE OF PERMIT FEES**

SECTION B101 – PERMIT FEES

Total Valuation	Fee
\$2,500 or less	No fee, unless inspection required, in which case a \$15.00 fee for each inspection shall be charged.
\$2,500 to \$50,000	\$15.00 for the first \$2,500 plus \$5.00 for each additional thousand or fraction thereof, to and including \$50,000.
\$50,000 to \$100,000	\$260.00 for the first \$50,000 plus \$4.00 for each additional thousand or fraction thereof, to and including \$100,000.
\$100,000 to \$500,000	\$460.00 for the first \$100,000 plus \$3.00 for each additional thousand or fraction thereof, to and including \$500,000.
\$500,000 and up	\$1,660.00 for the first \$500,000 plus \$2.00 for each additional thousand or fraction thereof.

SECTION B102 – MOVING FEE

For the moving of any building or structure, the fee shall be \$100.

SECTION B103 – DEMOLITION FEE

For the demolition of any building or structures, the fee shall be:

0 up to \$100,000 cu ft	\$50.00
100,000 cu ft and over	\$0.50/1,000 cu ft

SECTION B104 – PENALTIES

Where work for which a permit is required by this Code is started or proceeded prior to obtaining said permit, the fees herein specified shall be doubled, but the payment of such double fee shall not relieve any persons from fully complying with the requirements of this Code in the execution of the work nor from any other penalties prescribed herein.

SECTION B105 – PLAN-CHECKING FEES

When the valuation of the proposed construction exceeds \$1,000.00 and a plan is required to be submitted by 104.2. a plan-checking fee shall be paid to the building official at the time of submitting plans and specifications for checking. Said plan-checking fee shall be equal to one-half of the building permit fee as set forth in 104.7. Such plan-checking fee is in addition to the building permit fee.

PRIVATE ACTS-UNITED CITIES GAS FRANCHISE FEE
