RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, SALE, AND PAYMENT OF INTEREST-BEARING 3-YEAR CAPITAL OUTLAY NOTES

NOT TO EXCEED \$81,000

ORIGINAL

WHEREAS, The Governing Body Of Hamblen County, Tennessee (The Local Government) Has Determined That It Is Necessary And Desirable To Provide Funds For The Following Public Works Project (The "Project):

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that the Project will promote or provide a traditional governmental activity or otherwise fulfill a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Parts I, IV, and VI of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act"), local governments in Tennessee are authorized to finance the cost of this Project through the issuance and sale of interest bearing capital outlay notes upon the approval of the State Director of Local Finance: and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body finds that it is advantageous to the Local Government to authorize the issuance of capital outlay notes to finance the cost of the Project:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of Hamblen County, Tennessee as follows:

Section I. That, for the purpose of providing funds to finance the cost of the Project in and for the Local Government, the Chief Executive Officer of the Local Government is hereby authorized in accordance with the terms of this resolution to issue and sell interest-bearing capital outlay notes in a principal amount not to exceed Eighty-One Thousand Dollars (\$81,000) (the "Notes) at either a competitive public sale or at a private negotiated sale upon approval of the State Director of Local Finance pursuant to the terms, provisions, and conditions permitted by law. The Notes shall be designated (Garbage Fund Capital Outlay Notes, Series 2001", shall be numbered serially from 1 upwards; shall be dated as of the date of issuance; shall be in denomination (s) as agreed upon with the purchaser; shall be sold at not less than 99% of par value and accrued interest; and shall bear interest at a rate or rates no to exceed seven percent (7%) per annum, and in no event shall the rate exceed the legal limit provided by law.

Section 2. That, the Notes shall mature not later than three (3) years after the date of issuance and that the Notes and any extension or renewal notes shall not exceed the reasonably expected economic life of the Project, which is hereby certified by the Governing Body to be at least three years. Provided, however, that each year the Notes are outstanding, one-third (1/3). But in no event not less than one-ninth (1/9), of the original principal amount of the Notes shall mature without renewal but subject to prior redemption.

Section 3. That, the Notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of the Local Government, in whole or in part, at any time, at the principal amount and accrued interest to the date of redemption, without a premium, or, if sold at par, with or without a premium of not exceeding one percent (1%) of the principal amount.

Section 4. That, the Notes shall be direct general obligations of the Local Government, for which the punctual payment of the principal and interest on the notes, the full faith and credit of the Local Government is irrevocably pledged and the Local Government hereby pledges its taxing power as to all taxable property in the Local Government for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes. The Governing Body of the Local Government hereby authorizes the levy and collection of a special tax on all taxable property of the Local government over and above all other taxes authorized by the Local government to create a sinking fund to retire the Notes with interest as they mature in an amount necessary for that purpose.

If applicable, the Notes shall be further secured by Hamblen County Government. (If the revenues generated by Project are to be applied as additional security for the Notes, describe such revenues here.)

Section 5. That, the Notes shall be executed in the name of the Local Government and bear the manual signature of the chief executive officer of the Local Government and the manual signature of the County Clerk with the Local

Government seal affixed thereon: and shall be payable as to principal and interest at the office of the County Executive of the Local Government or the paying agent duly appointed by the Local Government. Proceeds of the Notes shall be deposited with the Trustee of the Local Government and shall be paid out for the purpose of financing the Project pursuant to this Resolution and as required by law.

Section 6. That, the Notes will be issued in fully registered form and that at all times during which any Notes remains outstanding and unpaid, the Local Government or its agent shall keep or cause to be kept at its office a note register, if held by an agent of the Local Government, shall at all times be open for inspection by the Local Government or any duly authorized officer of the Local Government. Each Note shall have the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument and shall be transferable only upon the note register kept by the Local Government or its agent, by the registered owner of the Note in person or by the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon presentation and surrender to the Local Government or its agent together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Local Government duly executed by the registered owner of the registered owner of any such Note, the Local Government shall issue in the name of the transferee a new registered note or notes of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity as the surrendered Notes. The Local Government shall not be obligated to make any such Note transfer during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date of the Notes or, in the case of any redemption of the Notes, during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date of redemption.

Section 7. That, the Notes shall be in substantially the form attached hereto and shall recite that the Notes are issued pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated.

Section 8. That, the Notes shall be sold only after the receipt of the written approval of the State Director of Local Finance for the sale of the Notes.

Section 9. That, the notes are hereby designated as qualified tax-exempt obligations for purpose of Section 265 (b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

Section 10. That, after the issuance and sale of the Notes, and for each year that any of the Notes are outstanding, the Local Government shall submit its annual budget to the State Director of Local Finance for approval immediately upon the Local Government's adoption of the budget.

Section 11. That, if any of the Notes shall remain unpaid at the end of three (3) years from the issue date, then the unpaid Notes shall be renewed or extended as permitted by law, or retired from the funds of the Local Government or be converted into bonds pursuant to Chapter 11 of Title 9 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, or any other law, or be otherwise liquidated as approval by the State Director of Local Finance.

Section 12. That, all orders or resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed in so far as such conflict exists and this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners does hereby adopt the following amendment insertion of Article 9B Moore-Murrell Field Zoning to the Zoning Resolution:

PURPOSE OF RESOLUTION TO LIMIT HEIGHT OF OBJECTS AROUND THE MORRISTOWN MUNICIPAL AIRPORT/MOORE-MURRELL FIELD

A RESOLUTION REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES AND OBJECTS OF NATURAL GROWTH, AND OTHERWISE REGULATING THE USE OF PROPERTY, IN THE VICINITY OF THE MOORE-MURRELL FIELD BY CREATING APPROPRIATE ZONES AND ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN THE RESTRICTIONS AND BOUNDARIES OF SUCH ZONES; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS USED HEREIN; REFERRING TO THE ZONING MAP WHICH ARE INCORPORATED IN AND MADE A PART OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT BY THE BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES.

This resolution is adopted pursuant to the authority conferred by Section 42-6-101 through 42-6-115 of the Tennessee Code Annotated. It is hereby found that an obstruction has the potential for endangering the lives and property of users of Moore-Murrell Field, and property or occupants of land in its vicinity; that an obstruction may affect existing and future instrument approach minimums of Moore-Murrell Field; and that an obstruction may reduce the size of areas available for landing, takeoff, and maneuvering of aircraft, thus tending to destroy or impair the utility of Moore-Murrell Field and the public investment therein. Accordingly, it is declared:

- (1) that the creation or establishment of an obstruction has the potential of being a public nuisance and may injure the region served by Moore-Murrell Field:
- (2) that it is necessary in the interest of the public health, public safety, and general welfare that the creation or establishment of obstructions that are a hazard to air navigation be prevented; and
- (3) that the prevention of these obstructions should be accomplished, to the extent legally possible, by the exercise of the police power without compensation.

It is further declared that the prevention of the creation or establishment of hazards to air navigation, the elimination, removal, alteration or mitigation of hazards to air navigation, or marking and lighting of obstructions are public purposes for which a political subdivision may raise and expend public funds and acquire land or interests in land.

ARTICLE 9B MOORE-MURRELL FIELD ZONING

9B.2 **DEFINITIONS**

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- 1) AIRPORT means Moore-Murrell Field.
- 2) AIRPORT ELEVATION 1313 feet above mean sea level.
- 3) APPR()ACH SURFACE A surface longitudinally centered on the extended runway centerline, extending outward and upward from the end of the primary surface and at the same slope as the approach zone height limitation slope set forth in 9B.4 of this Resolution. In plan the perimeter of the approach surface coincides with the perimeter of the approach zone.
- 4) APPROACH, TRANSITIONAL, HORIZONTAL, and CONICAL ZONES -These zones are set forth in 9B.3 of this Resolution.
- 5) BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS The duly appointed Hamblen County Board of Zoning Appeals is empowered to hear and decide on issues related to adjustments, appeals, special exceptions, or variances to the established Zoning Resolution. The Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) may also be referred to as the Board of Adjustments or the Board of Appeals.
- 6) CONICAL SURFACE A surface extending outward and upward from the periphery of the horizontal surface at a slope of 20 to 1 for a horizontal distance of 4,000 feet.
- 7) HAZARD TO AIR NAVIGATION An obstruction determined to have a substantial adverse effect on the safe and efficient utilization of the navigable airspace.
- 8) HEIGHT For the purpose of determining the height limits in all zones set forth in this Resolution and shown on the zoning map, the datum shall be mean sea level elevation unless otherwise specified.
- 9) HORIZONTAL SURFACE A horizontal plane 150 feet above the established airport elevation, the perimeter of which in plan coincides with the perimeter of the horizontal zone.
- 10) LARGER THAN UTILITY RUNWAY A runway that is constructed for and intended to be used by propeller driven aircraft of greater than 12,500 pounds maximum gross weight and jet powered aircraft.
- 11) NONCONFORMING USE Any pre-existing structure, object of natural growth, or use of land which is inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution or an amendment thereto.
- 12) NONPRECISION INSTRUMENT RUNWAY A runway having an existing instrument approach procedure utilizing air navigation facilities with only horizontal guidance, or area type navigation equipment, for which a straight-in nonprecision instrument approach has been approved or planned.
- 13) OBSTRUCTION Any structure, growth, or other object, including a mobile object, which exceeds a limiting height set forth in 9B.4 of this Resolution.
- 14) PERSON An individual, firm, partnership, corporation, company, association, joint stock association or government entity; includes a trustee, a receiver, an assignee, or a similar representative of any of them.
- 15) PRECISION INSTRUMENT RUNWAY A runway having an existing instrument approach procedure utilizing an Instrument Landing System (ILS) or a Precision Approach Radar (PAR). It also means a runway for which a precision approach system is planned and is so indicated on an approved airport layout plan or any other planning document.
- 16) PRIMARY SURFACE A surface longitudinally centered on a runway. When the runway has a specially prepared hard surface, the primary surface extends 200 feet beyond each end of that runway; for military runways or when the runway has no specially prepared hard surface, or planned hard surface, the primary surface ends at each end of that runway. The width of the primary surface is set forth in 9B.3 of this



⁹B.1 <u>SHORT_TITLE</u> This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the Moore-Murrell Zoning Resolution.

Resolution. The elevation of any point on the primary surface is the same as the elevation of the nearest point on the runway centerline.

- 17) RUNWAY A defined area on an airport prepared for landing and takeoff of aircraft along its length.
- 18) STRUCTURE An object, including a mobile object, constructed or installed by man, including but without limitation, buildings, towers, cranes, smokestacks, earth formation, and overhead transmission lines.
- 19) TRANSITIONAL SURFACES These surfaces extend outward at 90 degree angles to the runway centerline and the runway centerline extended at a slope of seven (7) feet horizontally for each foot vertically from the sides of the primary and approach surfaces to where they intersect the horizontal and conical surfaces. Transitional surfaces for those portions of the precision approach surface, which project through and beyond the limits of the conical surface, extend a distance of 5,000 feet measured horizontally from the edge of the approach surface and at 90 degree angles to the extended centerline.
- 20) TREE Any object of natural growth.
- 21) UTILITY RUNWAY A runway that is constructed for and intended to be used by propeller driven aircraft of 12,500 pounds maximum gross weight and less.
- 22) VISUAL RUNWAY A runway intended solely for the operation of aircraft using visual approach procedures.

9B.3 AIRPORT ZONES

In order to carry out the provisions of this Resolution, there are hereby created and established certain zones which include all of the land lying beneath the approach surfaces, transitional surfaces, horizontal surfaces, and conical surfaces as they apply to Moore-Murrell Field. Such zones are to be included as overlay districts to the official zoning map of Hamblen County, TN. An area located in more than one of the following zones is considered to be only in the zone with the more restrictive height limitation. The various zones are hereby established and defined as follows:

- 1) RUNWAY LARGER THAN UTILITY WITH A VISIBILITY MINIMUM GREATER THAN 3/4 MILE NONPRECISION INSTRUMENT APPROACH ZONE - The inner edge of this approach zone coincides with the width of the primary surface and is 500 feet wide. The approach zone expands outward uniformly to a width of 3,500 feet at a horizontal distance of 10,000 feet from the primary surface. Its centerline is the continuation of the centerline of the runway.
- 2) TRANSITIONAL ZONES The transitional zones are the areas beneath the transitional surfaces.
- 3) HORIZONTAL ZONE The horizontal zone is established by swinging arcs of 5,000 feet radii for all runways designated utility or visual, and 10,,000 feet for all others from the center of each end of the primary surface of each runway and connecting the adjacent arcs by drawing lines of tangent to those arcs. The horizontal zone does not include the approach and transitional zones.
- 4) CONICAL ZONE The conical zone is established as the area that commences at the periphery of the horizontal zone and extends outward therefrom a horizontal distance of 4,000 feet.

9B.4 AIRPORT ZONE HEIGHT LIMITATIONS

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Except as otherwise provided in this Resolution, no structure shall be erected, altered, or maintained, and no tree shall be allowed to grow in any zone created by this Resolution to a height in excess of the applicable height herein established for such zone. Such applicable height limitations are hereby established for each of the zones in question as follows:

1) RUNWAY LARGER THAN UTILITY WITH A VISIBILITY MINIMUM GREATER THAN 3/4 MILE NONPRECISION INSTRUMENT APPROACH ZONE - Slopes thirty-four (34) feet outward for each foot upward beginning at the end of and at the same elevation as the primary surface and extending to a horizontal distance of 10,000 feet along the extended runway centerline.



- 2) TRANSISTIONAL ZONES Slope seven (7) feet outward for each foot upward beginning at the sides of and at the same elevation as the primary surface and the approach surface, and extending to a height of 150 feet above the airport elevation which is 1313 feet above mean sea level. In addition to the foregoing, there are established height limits sloping seven (7) feet outward for each foot upward beginning at sides of and the same elevation as the approach surface, and extending to where they intersect the conical surface. Where the precision instrument runway approach zone projects beyond the conical zone, there are established height limits sloping seven (7) feet outward for each foot upward beginning at the sides of and the same elevation as the approach surface, and extending a horizontal distance of 5,000 feet measured at 90 degree angles to the extended runway centerline.
- 3) HORIZONTAL ZONE Established at 150 feet above the airport elevation or a height of 1463 feet above mean sea level.
- 4) CONICAL ZONE Slopes twenty (20) feet outward for each foot upward beginning at the periphery of the horizontal zone and at 150 feet above the airport elevation and extending to a height of 350 feet above the airport elevation (1663 feet above mean sea level).
- 5) EXCEPTED HEIGHT LIMITATIONS Nothing in this Resolution shall be construed as prohibiting the construction or maintenance of any structure, or growth of any tree to a height up to 50 feet above the surface of the land.

9B.5 USE RESTRICTION

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Resolution, no use may be made of land or water within any zone established by this Resolution in such a manner as to create electrical interference with navigational signals or radio communication between the airport and aircraft, make it difficult for pilots to distinguish between airport lights and others, result in glare in the eyes of pilots using the airport, impair visibility in the vicinity of the airport, create bird strike hazards, or otherwise in any way endanger or interfere with the landing, takeoff, or maneuvering of aircraft intending to use the airport.

9B.6 NONCONFORMING USES

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REGULATIONS NOT RETROACTIVE - The regulations prescribed in this Resolution shall not be construed to require the removal, lowering, or other change or alteration of any structure or tree not conforming to these regulations as the effective date of this Resolution, or otherwise interfere with the continuance of a nonconforming use. Nothing contained herein shall require any change in the construction, alteration, or intended use of any structure, the construction or alteration of which was begun prior to the effective date of this Resolution, and is diligently prosecuted.

9B.7 <u>PERMITŜ</u> 1) Co

CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS (CFR) - According to Title 14 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Chapter 1, "No structure or building which would require a 'Notice of Construction or Alteration' (FAA Form 7460-1) under Federal Aviation Regulation Part 77 Objects Affecting Navigable Airspace Subpart B (FAR 77 Subpart B) shall be permitted unless a 'Determination of No Hazard' under FAR 77 Subparts B, D, or E is first obtained from the Federal Aviation Administration." Copies of FAA Form 7460-1 may be obtained from the headquarters of the Federal Aviation Administration and the regional offices.

2) FUTURE USES - Except as specifically provided in a, b, and c hereunder, no material change shall be made in the use of land, no structure shall be erected or otherwise established, and no tree shall be planted in any zone hereby created unless a permit therefore shall have been applied for and granted. Each application for a permit shall indicate the purpose for which the permit is desired, with sufficient particularity to permit it to be determined whether the resulting use, structure, or tree would conform to the regulations herein prescribed. If such determination is in the affirmative, the permit shall be granted. No permit for a use inconsistent with the provisions of this Resolution shall be granted unless a variance has been approved in accordance with 9B.7 (5).



- a) In the areas lying within the limits of the horizontal zone and the conical zone, no permit shall be required for any tree or structure less than seventy-five (75) feet of vertical height above the ground.
- b) In areas lying within the limits of the approach zones but at a horizontal distance of not less than 4,200 feet from each end of the runway, no permit shall be required for any tree or structure less than seventy-five (75) feet of vertical height above the ground, except when such tree or structure would extend above the height limit prescribed for such approach zones.
- c) In the areas lying within the limits of the transition zones beyond the perimeter of the horizontal zone, no permit shall be required for any tree or structure less than seventy-five (75) feet of vertical height above the ground, except when such tree or structure, because of terrain, land contour, or topographic features, would extend above the height limit prescribed for such transition zones. Nothing contained in any of the foregoing exceptions shall be construed as permitting or intending to permit any construction, or alteration or any structure, or growth of any tree in excess of any of the height limits established by this Resolution except as set forth in 9B.4.
- 3) EXISTING USES No permit shall be granted that would allow the establishment or creation of any obstruction or permit a nonconforming use, structure, or tree to become a greater hazard to air navigation, than it was on the effective date of this Resolution or any amendments thereto or than it is when the application for a permit is made. Except as indicated, all applications for such a permit shall be granted.
- 4) NONCONFORMING USES ABANDONED OR DESTROYED Whenever the appropriate governing body determines that nonconforming tree or structure has been abandoned or more than 80 percent torn down, physically deteriorated, or decayed, no permit shall be granted that would allow such structure or tree to exceed the applicable height limit or otherwise deviate from the zoning regulations.
- VARIANCES Any person desiring to erect or increase the height of any structure, or 5) permit the growth of any tree, or use property, not in accordance with the regulations prescribed in this Resolution, may apply to the Board of Zoning Appeals for a variance from such regulations. The application for variance shall be accompanied by a determination from the Federal Aviation Administration as to the effect of the proposal on the operation of air navigation facilities and the safe, efficient use of navigable airspace. Such variances shall be allowed where it is duly found that a literal application or enforcement of the regulations will result in unnecessary hardship and relief granted, will not create a hazard to air navigation, will do substantial justice, and will be in accordance with the spirit of this Resolution. Additionally, no application for variance to the requirements of this Resolution may be considered by the Board of Zoning Appeals unless a copy of the application has been furnished to the Airport Manager for advice as to aeronautical effects of the variance. If the Airport Manager does not respond to the application within 15 days after receipt, the Board of Zoning Appeals may act on its own to grant or deny said application.

9B.8 **ENFORCEMENT**

It shall be the duty of the appropriate governing body to administer and enforce the regulation prescribed herein. Applications for permits and variances shall be made to the appropriate governing body upon a form published for that purpose. Applications required by this Resolution to be submitted to the appropriate governing body shall be promptly considered and granted or denied. Application for action by the Board of Zoning Appeals shall be forthwith transmitted by the appropriate governing body. (Application Atch)

9B.9 <u>APPEALS AND ADJUSTMENTS</u> Applicants may seek adjustments, appeals, special exceptions, and interpretation to this Resolution through the Board of Zoning Appeals.



9B.10 PENALTIES

Each violation of this Resolution or of any regulations, order, or ruling promulgated hereunder shall be issued penalties as prescribed within the Zoning Resolution.

9B.11 <u>CONFLICTING REGULATIONS</u> Where there exists a conflict between any of the regulations or limitations prescribed in this Resolution and any other regulations applicable to the same area, whether the conflict be with respect to the height of structures or trees, and the use of land, or any other matter, the more stringent limitation or requirement shall govern and prevail.

9B.12 SEVERABILITY

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In any of the provisions of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstances are held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION PURSUANT TO TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED §§ 13-3-101 ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Planning Commission was created by Private Act of the Tennessee General Assembly during the 1967/1968 legislative session (Private Acts of 1968, Chapter 350); and

WHEREAS, the case of <u>City of Alcoa, et al v. Blount County</u>, 658 SW 2nd 116 (Tenn. App. 1983) has cast doubt on the legality of any regional planning commission created by Private Act if the terms of said Private Act vary from the general law applicable to all counties; and

WHEREAS, the Private Act creating the Hamblen County Planning Commission, and the amendments thereto, do vary in some respects from Tennessee law regarding regional planning commissions; and

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Legislative Body desires to eliminate any question regarding the legality of the existence of its regional planning commission; and

WHEREAS, the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee of the State Department of Economic and Community Development can establish a regional planning commission for Hamblen County and grant to it jurisdiction pursuant to T.C.A. SS 13-3-101 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners desires to have the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee of the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development establish the Hamblen County Planning Commission pursuant to the terms of Tennessee Code Annotated §S 13-3-101 et seq.; NOW

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners, assembled at its regularly scheduled meeting on April 19, 2001, hereby requests that the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee of the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development establish a Regional Planning Commission for Hamblen County, Tennessee pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated §\$ 13-3-101 et seq. and further adopts the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated §\$ 13-3-101 et seq. in their entirety.
