RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION TO AMEND ARTICLE 6, GENERAL PROVISIONS, OF THE ZONING RESOLUTION OF HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE REGARDING PRIVATE PERMANENT EASEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Planning Commission was created by Private Acts of 1968, Chapter 350 and became functional in that same year; and

WHEREAS, by Private Acts of 1973, Chapter 38, Hamblen County was authorized to adopt and did adopt a Zoning Resolution applicable to Hamblen County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, prior to the creation of the Hamblen County Planning Commission and the adoption of zoning regulations within Hamblen County, certain plats of subdivisions where recorded in the Register's Office of Hamblen County, Tennessee which provided for roads which were never paved nor accepted by Hamblen County as part of its county road system and therefore constitute private permanent easements; and

WHEREAS, the potential exists for the development and construction of private condominium complexes and/or gated communities wherein private permanent easements will be created which are not dedicated as public roads nor accepted by the county as public roads; and

WHEREAS, for the Hamblen County Emergency Communication District (911) to be able to include residents living on private permanent easements in its system, the private permanent easement must have a name and addresses must be assigned; and

WHEREAS, as a safety measure Hamblen County would like to provide this 911 listing to residents who reside on private permanent easements by being able to name such private permanent easements, assign addresses and have signs erected to designate the names of private permanent easements but without such acts constituting the exercise of any dominion over or responsibility with regard to said private permanent easements; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 13-3-411(b) allows the planning commission to recommend and the county legislative body to adopt regulations governing a proposed private permanent easement in a proposed subdivision which insures that the county shall not be responsible for the future maintenance of such private permanent easements; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Hamblen County Planning Commission that such regulations be adopted by the Hamblen County Legislative Body and have the proposed regulations added as Article 6.10 under the Hamblen County Zoning Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners has held a public hearing on April 18, 2002 and advertised the proposed amendment on April ____, 2002;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners hereby adopts the following amendment for insertion as Article 6.10 of the Hamblen County Zoning Resolution:

Article 6.10

- (a) A "private permanent easement" is hereby defined as any legal, private permanent easement or right of way providing egress and ingress from a residence to a public road as listed on the county road map and which private permanent easement has never been accepted by the county as a public road.
- (b) For safety reasons, the Hamblen County Planning Commission is hereby empowered to name any such private permanent easements and assign addresses to residences located on the private permanent easements and instruct the Hamblen County Road Department to place signs designating the name of the private permanent easement so that residents residing on said private permanent easements may be listed in the 911 computer system.
- (c) If a recorded plat exists for the private permanent easement as defined herein, and the plat provides a name for the private permanent easement, then that name shall be used. If no such name is stated on the recorded plat or no recorded plat exists, then the Hamblen County Planning Commission will attempt to cooperate with the owners of residences along said private permanent easement to establish a non-duplicated name; however, barring any such agreement, the planning commission shall have the authority to name the private permanent easement, assign addresses and place appropriate signs thereon.
- (d) To distinguish such private permanent easements from a public road, any such sign designating the name of such private permanent easement shall be a white sign with black lettering as opposed to the normal green sign with white lettering now being used to designate the County's public roads.

- (e) No action taken by Hamblen County, the Hamblen County Road Department or the Hamblen County Planning Commission under this Article 6.10 shall in any way be construed as the acceptance of such private permanent easement as a county road and no acts taken by Hamblen County or the Hamblen County Planning Commission shall make Hamblen County responsible for any future maintenance of such private permanent easement.
- (f) Nothing herein shall be construed as authorizing or encouraging development in contravention of this Zoning Resolution, the Hamblen County Subdivision Regulations or the laws of the State of Tennessee.

PRIVATE ACT TO LEVY HOTEL/MOTEL TAX

AN ACT

relative to the levy of a privilege tax on the occupancy of any rooms, lodgings or accommodations furnished to transients by any hotel, inn, tourist courts, tourist cabins, motel or any place in which rooms, lodgings, or accommodations are furnished for transients for a consideration in Hamblen County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. For the purposes of this Act:

- (a) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, social club, fraternal organization, joint stock company, corporation, estate, trust, business trust, receiver, trustee, syndicate, governmental unit other than the United States or any of its agencies, or any other group or combination acting as a unit.
- (b) "Hotel" means any structure or space, or any portion thereof, which is occupied or intended or designed for occupancy by transients for dwelling, lodging or sleeping purposes, and includes any hotel, inn, tourist camp, tourist court, tourist cabin, motel or any place in which rooms, lodgings or accommodations are furnished to transients for a consideration.
- (c) "Occupancy" means the use or possession, or the right to the use or possession, of any room, lodgings or accommodations in any hotel.
- (d) "Transient" means any person who exercises occupancy or is entitled to occupancy for any rooms, lodgings or accommodations in a hotel for a period of less than thirty (30) continuous days.
- (e) "Consideration" means the consideration charged, whether or not received, for the occupancy in a hotel valued in money whether to be received in money, goods, labor or otherwise, including all receipts, cash, credits, property and services of any kind or nature without any deduction therefrom whatsoever. Nothing in this definition shall be construed to imply that consideration is charged when the space provided to the person is complimentary from the operator and no consideration is charged to or received from any person.
 - (f) "County" means Hamblen County, Tennessee.
- (g) "Operator" means the person operating the hotel whether as owner, lessee or otherwise, and shall include governmental entities.
 - (h) "Clerk" means the County Clerk of Hamblen County, Tennessee.

SECTION 2. Hamblen County is authorized to levy a privilege tax upon the privilege of occupancy in any hotel of each transient, in the amount of five percent (5%) of the rate charged by the operator.

SECTION 3. The proceeds received by the County from the tax shall be designated and used for the operation, maintenance and conduct of Cherokee Park as a park for public recreation.

SECTION 4. Such tax shall be added by each and every operator to each invoice prepared by the operator for the occupancy of his or her hotel and to be given directly or transmitted to the transient and shall be collected by such operator from the transient and remitted to Hamblen County

When a person has maintained occupancy for thirty (30) continuous days, that person shall receive from the operator a refund or credit for the tax previously collected from or charged to him or her, and the operator shall receive credit for the amount of such tax if previously paid or reported to the County.

SECTION 5.

- (a) The tax levied shall be remitted by all operators who lease, rent or charge for any rooms or spaces in hotels within the County, to the County Clerk or such other officer as may by resolution be charged with the duty of collection thereof, said tax to be remitted to such officer not later than the twentieth $(20^{\rm th})$ day of each month for the preceding month. The operator is hereby required to collect the said tax from the transient at the time of the presentation of the invoice for said occupancy, as may be the custom of the operator, and if credit is granted by the operator to the transient, then the obligation to the County entitled to such tax shall be that of the operator.
- (b) For the purpose of compensating the operator in accounting for remitting the tax levied by these sections the operator shall be allowed two percent (2%) of the amount of the tax due and accounted for and remitted to the Clerk in the form of a deduction in submitting his or her report and paying the amount due by such operator, provided the amount due was not delinquent at the time of payment.

SECTION 6. The Clerk, or other authorized collector of the tax, shall be responsible for the collection of said tax and shall place the proceeds of such tax in accounts for the purposes stated herein. A monthly tax return shall be filed under oath with the Clerk by the operator with such number of copies thereof as the Clerk may reasonably require for the collection of such tax. The report of the operator shall include such facts and information as may be deemed reasonable for the verification of the tax due. The form of such report shall be developed by the Clerk and approved by the Hamblen County legislative body prior to use. The Clerk shall audit each operator in the County at least once per year and shall report on the audits made on a quarterly basis to the Hamblen County legislative body.

The Hamblen County legislative body is hereby authorized to adopt resolutions to provide reasonable rules and regulations for the implementation of the provisions of this Act, including the form for such reports.

SECTION 7. No operator of a hotel shall advertise or state in any manner, whether directly or indirectly, that the tax or any part thereof will be assumed or absorbed by the operator or that it will not be added to the rent, or that if added, any part will be refunded.

SECTION 8. Taxes collected by an operator which are not remitted to the County Clerk on or before the due dates shall be delinquent. An operator shall be liable for interest on such delinquent taxes from the due date at the rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum, and in addition for penalty of one percent (1%) for each month or fraction thereof such taxes are delinquent. Such interest and penalty shall become a part of the tax herein required to be remitted. Each occurrence of willful refusal of an operator to collect or remit the tax or willful refusal of a transient to pay the tax imposed is hereby declared to be unlawful and shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable, upon conviction, of a fine not in excess of fifty dollars (\$50.00).

SECTION 9. It shall be the duty of every operator liable for the collection and payment to the County of any tax imposed by this Act to keep and preserve for a period of three (3) years all records as may be necessary to determine the amount of such tax as he or she may have been liable for the collection of and payment to the County, which records the County Clerk shall have the right to inspect at all reasonable times.

SECTION 10. The County Clerk in administering and enforcing the provisions of this Act shall have as additional powers, those powers and duties with respect to collecting taxes as provided in Title 67, Tennessee Code Annotated, or otherwise provided by law for the County Clerks.

For his or her services in administering and enforcing the provisions of this Act, the County Clerk shall be entitled to retain as a commission five percent (5%) of the taxes so collected.

Upon any claim of illegal assessment and collection, the taxpayer shall have the remedies provided in Title 67, Tennessee Code Annotated, it being the intent of this Act that the provisions of law which apply to the recovery of state taxes illegally assessed and collected under the authority of this Act shall apply to Hamblen County also; provided further, the County Clerk shall possess those powers and duties as provided in Tennessee Code Annotated § 67-1-707 for the County Clerks.

With respect to the adjustment and settlement with taxpayers, all errors of County taxes collected by the County Clerk under the authority of this Act shall be refunded by the County Clerk.

Notice of any tax paid under protest shall be given to the County Clerk and the Hamblen County Executive is the designated county officer against whom suit may be brought for recovery.

- **SECTION 11.** The proceeds of the tax authorized by this Act shall be used for the purposes stated in Section 3 of this Act.
- **SECTION 12.** The application of the Hamblen County tax on the privilege of occupancy of a hotel imposed herein shall be limited to the occupancy of hotels located within its boundaries but outside the boundaries of any municipality which has levied a tax on such occupancy prior to the adoption of this tax by Hamblen County.
- **SECTION 13.** If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to that end, the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.
- **SECTION 14.** This Act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the County legislative body of Hamblen County. Its approval or non-approval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the County legislative body and certified by the presiding officer of the County legislative body to the Secretary of State.
- **SECTION 15.** For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Act, it shall become effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided by Section 14.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between BLOUNT COUNTY, Tennessee, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, (hereinafter "Blount County") and HAMBLEN
COUNTY, Tennessee, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, (hereinafter "HAMBLEN County").
WITNESSETH:
WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated § § 37-1-116, 37-5-501 and 37-5-510, Blount County operates a juvenile detention center for children (the "Blount County Center"); and
WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated § 37-1-116(f), HAMBLEN County desires to contract with Blount County for placement in the Blount County Center of children under the jurisdiction of the juvenile court of HAMBLEN County.
NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:
1. Subject to the availability of space, Blount County shall provide County with detention services and/or temporary holding resource services at the HAMBLEN
Blount County Center in accordance with law for any child the juvenile court of County has ordered be placed into custody at the Blount County Center. While at the Blount County Center, any such child will receive food, shelter and such other physical necessities as may be determined by the director of the center and will be permitted to participate in such educational, recreational and other programs as are offered at the center at that time unless the director determines otherwise.
2. HAMBLEN County shall be responsible for transporting any such child placed into custody at the Blount Count Center to and from the center.
3. HAMBLEN County shall pay Blount County the sum of \$120.00 dollars per child for each twenty-four (24) hours period or part thereof that such child is in custody at the Blount County Center under the terms of this agreement.
4. The director of the Blount County Center may obtain routine and emergency medical and dental care for any such child placed into custody at the center as determined by the director. HAMBLEN County shall be responsible for and shall pay for all routine and emergency medical and dental care expenses incurred for the care and treatment of any such child and shall indemnify and hold Blount County harmless therefrom.
5. Blount County shall bill <u>HAMBLEN</u> County monthly for all charges and expenses owed by <u>HAMBLEN</u> County for the services rendered at the Blount County

SOFTWARE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

I. INTRODUCTION

Hamblen County, Tennessee (herein referred to as the County) is requesting proposals for a fully integrated general ledger software package.

The purpose of the request for proposal (RFP) is to define the County's requirements, solicit proposals from qualifying firms and representatives, and to gain adequate information from which the County may evaluate the services proposed. The County may reject any proposal not meeting the requirements listed in this document. The County reserves the right to not award to any of the proposers, or to reject all proposals and request new ones. The County reserves the right to cancel the RFP in its entirety at anytime at the County's discretion. Hamblen County reserves the right of accepting and/or rejecting any and/or all bids or parts of bids where doing so serves the best interest of Hamblen County.

The County will choose the proposal that best fits its needs and the needs of its accounting requirements. The County is not obligated to award the contract based on the cost alone.

II. PROPOSAL SPECIFICATIONS

A. Covered modules/accounting services

The County is issuing this RFP on behalf of its Finance Department. All proposals shall include a cost quote for the individual modules stated in **Exhibit A** of this document or a group rate including all of the modules listed. The census in **Exhibit B** lists the user(s) of each module. The software package must be able to run in a Windows 2000 Client/Server environment (and/or upgradeable to Sequel Server) and be able to print to the following types of printers:

B. Submission of Proposal

1. All proposals should be submitted to the following:

All proposals will be presented to the Executive committee on May 20th, 2002.

- 2. Proposals shall be received at the above address no later than 4:00PM EST, April 15th, 2002. Proposals received after this time will be returned to the proposer unopened.
- 3. Proposers are required to submit three (3) copies of their proposal.
- 4. Proposers may submit more than one proposal, provided that each proposal is submitted independently and meets all of the proposal requirements separate from the other proposals. Each proposal must be sequentially labeled as to identify the County that a proposal has issued more than one proposal. For example "XYZ Insurance Proposal #1" and "XYZ Insurance Proposal #2," and so forth.
- 5. All proposals become property of the County upon submittal, and upon completion of the evaluation, will become a matter of public record.
- 6. All proposers must submit proposals based on a one-year minimum maintenance and service contract, but the County prefers a contract length of three years.

Failure to comply with guidelines set by Hamblen County Government could result in the rejection of your proposal.

D. Proposal Evaluation Process

After the proposal due date, County staff will begin the process of reviewing the proposals and evaluating them based on the overall quality of the proposal. Each proposal meeting the minimum requirements of this document will be presented to the Executive Committee of County Commission for their consideration, with the Finance Director making a recommendation.

E. Time limit for RFP

All submitted proposals shall be valid until June 30, 2002.

F. Contract Duration

The County is seeking a twelve (12) month contract from July 1, 2002-June 30, 2003, with costs being less or equal to those stated in the awarded proposal. The County also is seeking a provision allowing for an annual renewal on a year-by-year basis, to be negotiated between the proposer and the County.

G. Proposal Amendment and Withdrawal

A submitted proposal may be withdrawn at any time for any reason. All requests for withdrawal must be made in writing to the address given in item II.A.1. Amendments to proposals will not be accepted, however a proposer can withdraw a proposal and resubmit another so long as it is prior to the proposal due date. Proposers should carefully review their proposals to ensure that all of the proposal specifications have been met.

H. Proposed Format

- There shall be no limit on the length of proposals, so long as all parts
 contain information requested or considered relevant to the proposal.
 Proposals are not to include advertising or brochures for any products
 other than those specifically requested or directly relating to the proposal.
- 2. The County reserves the right to request clarifications or additional information for any portion of submitted proposals.
- 3. The County reserves the right to further clarify and negotiate with the winning proposer subsequent to the awarding of the proposal and prior to the final contract execution. The County also reserves the right to negotiate with the next best proposer if negotiations fail to produce a final contract acceptable with the County.
- 4. All costs, including but not limited to, printing, travel, postage, and other expenses related to the submission of proposals will be the sole responsibility of the proposers.
- 5. Proposers shall respond to the final RFP and its associated addenda and amendments, including any clarifications or responses to questions. Only items in writing will be considered part of the official RFP.

6. Proposers may be requested by the County to appear before County Commission or its designated Committee to answer any questions or concerns. Proposers may also be requested to furnish additional information regarding their proposal.

K. Independent Price Determination

A proposer will not be considered if the price in the proposal was reached or determined with collusion, consultation, communication, or agreement on any matter with any other proposers or competitors.

L. Contractual Payment Amount

The actual amount in dollars (US) shall be listed in the proposal for each classification and coverage proposed in the proposal. The successful proposer shall guarantee the listed amount for the first twelve (12) months of the contract period, with each subsequent year to be negotiated between the County and the proposer on a year-by-year basis.

III. INSTALLATION AND TRAINING

The following minimum services are expected to be provided:

- A. On site training and installation of all software quoted in this RFP.
- B. Manuals for all modules quoted, either hardcopy or online.
- C. On site support for emergencies when all other avenues have failed to provide the necessary technical guidance for getting the software to work properly.
- D. A technical service whether by phone or on line provided to assist clients with questions and/ or problems using the software.
- E. Any special request made by the County upon reasonable notice.

IV. TECHNICAL SUPPORT

- A. All proposals must list the technical support delivered and the charges.
- B. Any upgrades that will be necessary to the software must be listed with prices.
- C. Any restrictions to technical support, including type of access, hours of operation, or number of support staff must be stated in the proposal.

- **C.** Please list any partnerships that make your product more valuable.

VI. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Only after approval by County Commission and the acceptance of a proposal will the County begin negotiating a final contract.
