**AGREEMENT CREATING THE HAMBLEN COUNTY ECONOMIC  
AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BOARD OF  
HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE**

**THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT** is made and entered into by and between, **HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE**, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, hereinafter referred to as "**COUNTY**," and the **CITY OF MORRISTOWN**, a Tennessee municipality created by Private Act of the Tennessee Legislature for 1903, Chapter 103, hereinafter referred to as "**CITY**."

**W I T N E S S E T H :**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 6-58-114, each county in the State of Tennessee must form a joint economic and community development board to engage in long-term planning; and

**WHEREAS**, this interlocal agreement is authorized by Tennessee Code Annotated § 5-1-113; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of both the County and City to establish by interlocal agreement a joint economic and community development board as required by law;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the above-stated premises, the parties hereto agree as follows:

**I. NAME**. There is hereby created the Joint Economic and Development Board of Hamblen County, Tennessee, hereinafter referred to as the "Board."

**II. PURPOSE**. The purpose of the Board shall be to foster communication relative to economic and community development between and among governmental entities, industry, and private citizens.

**III. AUTHORITY**. The Board is authorized to take the following actions:

- a. To discuss the interrelationship among commercial, governmental, private, and other interests in the

community and to identify ways to coordinate development efforts among these interests; and

- b. To develop recommendations regarding economic and community development and to advise the legislative bodies of the participating governments of those recommendations.

**IV. MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.** The membership of the Board shall be composed and selected as follows:

- a. The County Executive of Hamblen County, Tennessee.
- b. The City Administrator of the City of Morristown, Tennessee.
- c. The Chairman of the Hamblen County Commission.
- d. The Mayor of the City of Morristown, Tennessee.
- e. One person who owns land qualifying for classification and valuation under *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Title 67, Chapter 5, Part 10, to be appointed from a list of qualifying individuals prepared by the Hamblen County Trustee by mutual agreement of the County Executive and City Administrator.

**V. TERMS OF BOARD MEMBERS.** The terms for the County Executive, the Mayor and the Chairman of the Hamblen County Commission shall coincide with the terms of office for those positions. The City Administrator shall serve by virtue of his position in government. The appointed landowner shall serve a four-year term and may be reappointed for no more than one additional term.

**VI. COMPOSITION OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.** There shall be an Executive Committee composed of the following members:

1. The County Executive of the County.
2. The City Administrator.

**VII. MEETINGS.** The County Executive shall call the first meeting of the Board and serve as interim chair until all Board members are elected. After the Board is complete, the Board shall meet at least four times annually and the Executive Committee shall meet at least eight

times annually. All meetings of the Board and the Executive Committee shall be documented by minutes and certification of attendance, and are subject to the Open Meetings Act as set forth in *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 8-44-101 *et seq.*

**VIII. OFFICERS.** At the first meeting after all Board members are chosen, the Board shall organize itself, adopt by-laws and elect a Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary-Treasurer from among the members. Officers of the Board shall be elected annually. The Chair shall call regular and special meetings of the Board and Executive Committee and preside over all meetings. The Vice-Chair shall serve as Chair in the Chair's absence. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep minutes of all meetings and shall serve as chief financial officer.

**IX. FUNDING.** In order to obtain revenues needed to provide meeting space, costs associated with providing adequate notice under the Open Meetings Act, and other functions necessary to the authority granted to the Board, activities of the Board shall be jointly funded by the participating governments. As provided in *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 6-58-114(g), the funding formula for determining the funds due from each government shall be determined by adding the population of the entire county as established by the last federal decennial census to the populations of each city as determined by the last federal decennial census or special census as provided for in *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 6-51-114, and then determining the percentage that the population of each governmental entity bears to the total amount. In the event of a special census, the formula shall be adjusted as provided in *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 6-58-114(g)(2). The Board may also accept and expend donations, grants, and payments from persons and entities other than the participating governments.

**X. BUDGETS.** An annual budget to fund the activities of the Board shall be recommended by the Executive Committee to the Board, which shall adopt a budget before the first day of April of each year. The total budgetary amount shall not exceed funds necessary to provide for meetings of the Board and costs incident thereto. After adoption of the budget, the funding formula established above shall then be applied to the total amount as the participating governments' contributions for the ensuing fiscal year. The budget and a statement of the amount due from each participating government shall be immediately filed with the appropriate officer of each government. In the event either the County or City does not fully fund its contribution, the Board may establish and impose such sanctions or conditions as it deems proper.

**XI. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.**

- a. **RULES OF ORDER.** The conduct of the Board, Executive Committee or any subcommittees thereof shall be governed by *Robert's Rules of Order*. Minutes shall be taken and preserved for each meeting of the Board, Executive Committee or any subcommittees thereof.
- b. **ACCOUNTS.** The Board shall maintain an account separate and apart from the accounts and funds of the County and City. Funds remaining in the account of the Board at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to either the County or City, but shall specifically remain funds and property of the Board. The Board shall not have the authority to bind or obligate the funds or assets of the County or City. The Board shall likewise have no power to pledge the general credit or taxing power of a participating government.
- c. **FISCAL YEAR.** The fiscal year of the Board shall begin on the first day of July of each year.

**XII. AMENDMENTS.** This Agreement may be amended by the adoption of any such amendments by both of the legislative bodies of the participating governments.

**XIII. DISSOLUTION.** The Board shall be dissolved and this Agreement terminated in the event the legislative bodies of the County and City approve such dissolution. Either participating government may withdraw from participation pursuant to this Agreement by approval by the same by the legislative body of the particular government. However, no motion to dissolve nor to withdraw from participation shall become effective for the ensuing fiscal year unless notice thereof is given to the other participating government at least six (6) months prior to the beginning of the Board's fiscal year. Upon the dissolution of the Board, all funds remaining in the Board's accounts shall be paid to the participating government according to the funding formula established by Paragraph X, which is then in effect.


**IX. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Agreement shall become effective upon its approval by the legislative bodies of both the County and City.



# RESOLUTION FOR LEVYING AN ADDITIONAL SALES AND USE TAX IN HAMBLEN COUNTY

BE IT RESOLVED by the county legislative body of Hamblen County, Tennessee:

**SECTION 1.** The resolution of the county legislative body of Hamblen County, Tennessee, imposing a local sales and use tax as authorized under the provisions of *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Sections 67-6-701 through 67-6-712, adopted by the county legislative body at a regular meeting of record in Minute Book \_\_\_\_\_, page \_\_\_\_\_, is amended to levy a local sales and use tax at a rate of 8.75%, not to exceed the maximum percentage as stated in the RETAILERS TAX ACT, *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 67-6-702, as amended, except as limited or modified by statute.

**SECTION 2.** If a majority of those voting in the election required by *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 67-6-706, vote for the increase in the tax imposed by this resolution, collection of the increased tax levied by this resolution shall begin on the first day of the month occurring thirty (30) or more days after the county election commission makes its official canvass of the election returns.

**SECTION 3.** The Department of Revenue of the State of Tennessee shall collect the additional tax imposed by this Resolution concurrent with the collection of the state tax and the local tax now being collected for Hamblen County, in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the Department.

**SECTION 4.** The Trustee is hereby authorized to contract with the Department of Revenue for the collection of the additional tax imposed by this Resolution, and to provide in the contract that the department may deduct from the tax collected a reasonable amount or percentage to cover the expense of the administration and collection of the tax.

**SECTION 5.** In the event the tax is collected by the Department of Revenue, suits for the recovery of any tax illegally assessed or collected shall be brought against the state Commissioner of Revenue and the Trustee.

**SECTION 6.** A certified copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the Department of Revenue by the County Clerk forthwith and shall be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in Hamblen County prior to the election called for in Section 2 hereof.

**Resolution in Opposition to Electric Industry Deregulation**

WHEREAS, California's electric industry deregulation initiative has been dangerous and disastrous;

WHEREAS, since the California General Assembly adopted electric industry deregulation legislation in 1996, some consumers' rates have tripled and the state's wholesale rates have undergone a significant increase, rising up to eight times the previous rates between January 2000 and January 2001;

WHEREAS, California utilities were strapped by a requirement to sell power to consumers at a fixed price, which has often been less than what they paid for it;

WHEREAS, when power usage peaked in California in the summer of 2000, the state was only able to meet its electricity demands after outside utilities and marketers sold the state surplus energy at significantly inflated prices;

WHEREAS, the operations of utilities throughout the West have been disrupted due to California's deregulation initiative;

WHEREAS, California's largest utilities, including Pacific Gas & Electric and Southern California Edison, have incurred a combined loss of \$9 billion in less than a year and are teetering on the brink of bankruptcy;

WHEREAS, the financial problems encountered by California's utilities create a spiraling problem, wherein as the companies' financial reserves are depleted, electricity generators are reluctant to deliver power for fear of not being paid;

WHEREAS, due to low supply and high demand, California utilities have been forced to initiate rolling blackouts across the state, leaving hundreds of thousands of citizens temporarily without power;

WHEREAS, reserve capacity remains so low that more blackouts are likely, and California will be reliant on outside marketers to meet minimum demand requirements;

WHEREAS, concerns about reliability and the solvency of California's investor-owned utilities have forced the state to authorize the use of taxpayer-versus ratepayer-money to assist with power purchases;

WHEREAS, the deregulation crisis in California has forced some industrial layoffs and shutdowns across the state, creating additional hardships on the state's citizens;

WHEREAS, California Governor Gray Davis described his state's deregulation initiative as a "colossal and dangerous" failure; and

WHEREAS, the deregulation crisis in California is also part of a national move toward deregulation, as well as of a nationwide energy crisis wherein natural gas prices, for example, continue to escalate, raising serious questions about our entire energy infrastructure;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Association of Tennessee Valley Governments (ATVG), representing the 201 counties and over 800 incorporated towns and cities within those counties in the seven-state TVA region, strongly opposes deregulation of the electric utility industry.

AND FURTHER, we urge your endorsement and active support of our resolution in opposition to the fundamental restructuring of the most basic industry in our nation.

The Tennessee Valley region supplied by TVA is benefited by low-cost rates and reliable, universally accessible power. In addition, TVA's management of the integrated Tennessee River system provides unparalleled benefits to the quality of life and economic viability of the seven-state region. We champion TVA as a federal, public power authority. We support TVA's original core mission.

Planning cautiously and deliberately for the changes that may occur as a result of electric industry deregulation with proven solutions to market power issues, transmission problems, and proper program design is not only prudent but also, especially as it involves TVA and the citizens and ratepayers of the Tennessee Valley, in the highest public interest.


