PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This agreement made as of February 18, 2005, between Hamblen County, Tennessee (Client) and Hatfield & Allen, Associates (H&A) to perform professional services for the assignment described as follows:

Project: Hamblen County Stormwater Management Compliance

Location: Hamlen County, Tennessee

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES: H&A agrees to perform the following Basic Services under this contract:

Three main areas of assistance are included in this contract. These areas include reporting, compliance evaluation and record keeping assistance. These are described specifically as:

A. We will assist Hamblen County in its efforts in complying with all storm water reporting requirements for the reporting year July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. This annual report is mandated as part of the EPA phase II final rule which requires NPDES permit coverage for storm water discharges from certain small municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s). Hamblen County is considered a **small MS4**; this is defined as any MS4 that is not already regulated under the Phase I storm water program

EPA guidelines require that six (6) areas must be addressed with the County's Storm Water Management Plan and evaluated annually as part of the reporting process. As part of our effort to assist the county in complying with the reporting requirements, we will evaluate these six areas as follows:

- Public Education and Outreach
- Public Participation/Involvement
- Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
- Construction Site Runoff Control
- Post-Construction Runoff Control
- Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping.

Our work will also include evaluating several broad categories and addressing the findings in the report. These categories are:

- The status of compliance with permit conditions, including an assessment of the appropriateness of the selected BMPs and progress toward achieving the selected measurable goals for each minimum measure;
- · Results of any information collected and analyzed, including monitoring data, if any;
- A summary of the storm water activities planned for the next reporting cycle;
- A change in any identified best management practices (BMPs or measurable goals for any minimum measure; and
- Notice of relying on another governmental entity to satisfy some of the permit obligations (if applicable).

- B. We will assist Hamblen County in evaluating its progress for the reporting year 2004-2005. If, upon evaluation of Hamblen County's storm water program, improved controls are identified as necessary, we will assist the county in revising their mix of BMPs to provide for a more effective program for this reporting year.
- C. We will assist Hamblen County in setting up a record keeping system that will comply with TDEC and EPA standards. These records are required by the NPDES permitting authority to be kept for at least 3 years and made accessible to the public at reasonable times during regular business hours. These records will not need to be submitted to the NPDES permitting authority unless the county is requested to do so.
- II. COMPENSATION: The compensation to be paid to H&A for providing the requested services shall be:
 - Estimated Fee of \$75.00 per hour not to exceed \$20,000 plus any applicable reimbursable (i.e. printing and travel expenses).
- III. PAYMENTS: Billings for services rendered will be made monthly and payment is due within thirty (30) days of receipt of Invoice. Unless special arrangements are made, a finance charge of 1 1/2% per month will be added to unpaid balances more than thirty (30) days old.
- IV. TERMINATION: The obligation to provide further services under this Agreement may be terminated without cause by either party upon ten (10) days written notice. On termination by either Client or H&A, Client shall pay H&A with respect to any services performed to the date of termination (including all reimbursable expenses incurred).
- V. REUSE OF DOCUMENTS: All documents including Drawings and Specifications prepared by H&A pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of service in respect to the Project. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Client or others on extensions of the Project or any other project unless requested in writing. Any reuse without written verification or adaptation by H&A for the specific purpose intended will he at Clients sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to H&A, and Client shall indemnify and hold harmless H&A from all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorneys' fees arising out of or resulting there from. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle H&A to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by Client and H&A.
- VI. ACCESS TO RECORDS: Unless otherwise stated, H&A will have access to all records for activities necessary for the performance of the services,
- VII. INDEMNIFICATIONS: If any claim is brought against either the Client or H&A by any third party, relating in whole or In part to the negligence of the Client or H&A, each party shall indemnify the other against any loss or judgment, including attorneys' fees and costs, to the extent that such loss or expense is caused by the party's negligence,
- VIII. INSURANCE: H&A shall secure and endeavor to maintain such insurance as will protect H&A from claims of negligence, bodily injury, death, or property damage which may arise from the performance of services under this Agreement.

- IX. RISK ALLOCATION: In recognition of the relative risks rewards and benefits of the project to both the Client and H&A, the risks have been allocated such that the Client agrees that, to the fullest extent permitted by law, H&A's total liability to the Client for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses, damages, or claim expenses arising out of this agreement from cause or causes, shall not exceed the amount of our fee or Fifty Thousand (\$50,000) dollars, whichever is greater. This limitation shall apply regardless of the cause of action or legal theory pled or asserted.
- X. DISPUTES RESOLUTION: It is agreed by both parties that all unsettled claims, counterclaims, disputes or other matters in question arising out of or related to this Agreement shall first be attempted to be resolved by mediation. This provision can be waived by the mutual consent of the parties, or by either party if Its rights would be irrevocably prejudiced by a delay in initiating arbitration or the right to file a lawsuit,
- XI. OPINIONS OF COST: Any opinion of probable cost prepared by H&A represents H&A's judgment as design professionals and is supplied for general guidance of the Client. Since H&A has no control over the marketplace, H&A does not guarantee the accuracy of such opinions as compared to bids or actual cost to Client,
- XII. GOVERNING LAW: Unless otherwise specified within this Agreement, this Agreement shall be governed by the Law of the State of Tennessee.

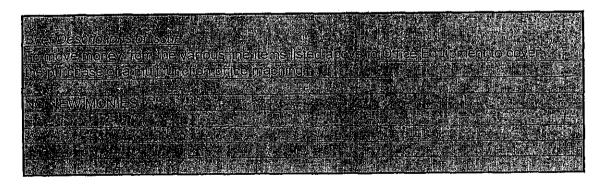

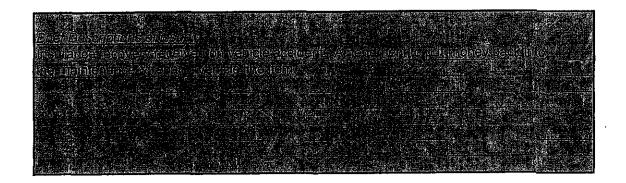

CHEROKEE PARK PARKING CONCESSION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this —— day of February, 2005, by and between HAMBLEN COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, hereinafter referred to as "County") and the MORRISTOWN EMERGENCY RESCUE SQUAD, hereinafter referred to as "MRS."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, County is the owner and operator of Cherokee Park, a public park dedicated to public recreation and entertainment; and

WHEREAS, County has constructed a facility known as the "Citizen Tribune-Jefferson Federal Amphitheater" (hereinafter referred to as "Amphitheater") for the purpose of providing entertainment to the citizens of Hamblen County and the Lakeway Area; and

WHEREAS, County will be periodically leasing the Amphitheater to various entertainment groups and organizations for the purpose of providing such entertainment ("Scheduled Events") to the citizens of Hamblen County and the Lakeway Area; and

WHEREAS, County has agreed to allow the MRS to be the exclusive concessionaire for parking services for such Scheduled Events; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have reached an agreement regarding the provision of parking and desire to reduce their agreement to writing; NOW

THEREFORE, in consideration of the above-stated premises, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Parking concessionaire. County hereby appoints and designates MRS as the exclusive concessionaire to provide parking services for scheduled events at the Amphitheater, and MRS hereby agrees to provide parking services for patrons attending scheduled events.
- 2. Parking fees. MRS shall be allowed to charge each vehicle attending a Scheduled Event a parking fee of Three Dollars (\$3.00) for parking privileges. MRS shall be allowed to retain Two Dollars (\$2.00) of each parking ticket sold and shall remit One Dollar (\$1.00) to County for deposit in the County Cherokee Park Fund. It is expressly understood and agreed to between the parties to this Agreement that the MRS shall

be entitled to all parking fees derived from the annual Fourth of July Celebration sponsored by the MRS at Cherokee Park.

- 3. Traffic control and parking. MRS agrees to provide sufficient personnel to be able to expeditiously and safely direct patrons to available parking spaces. To this end, MRS will contact the County one (1) day prior to any scheduled event to find out the number of tickets sold and make a determination as to how many members of MRS will be required to handle such number both before, during and following the scheduled event. MRS will cooperate with state and local law enforcement authorities for the orderly traffic control before, during and after the scheduled event.
- 4. Liability insurance. MRS shall be responsible for providing general liability insurance through an insurance company with an AM BEST rating of not less than A-. The liability insurance covering both personal and property damage must provide policy limits of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) in the aggregate, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) in medical payments and shall name County as an additional insured. Evidence of such policy shall be provided to County by MRS on an annual basis.
- 5. Access. MRS will be provided access to Cherokee Park management prior to the scheduled event to assist it with questions regarding the number of expected vehicles, the various areas available for parking and any other matters deemed necessary for MRS to properly carry out its obligations under this Agreement. MRS shall be responsible for installing an orange fence around designated parking areas.
- 6. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall exist for a period of one (1) year from the day and date first set out above and shall be automatically extended unless either party provides the other written notice of its desire to cancel this Agreement thirty (30) days prior to the date of termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing thirty (30) days prior written notice thereof at any time.
- 7. Entire agreement. This Agreement embodies the whole agreement of the parties. There are no promises, terms, conditions or obligations other than those contained herein. Any amendment or modification shall be reduced to writing and executed by the parties hereto.
- 8. Governing law. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee.
