TWELVE-YEAR CAPITAL OUTLAY NOTES—INFORMAL BID

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF
HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, AUTHORIZING THE
ISSUANCE, SALE, AND PAYMENT OF
CAPITAL OUTLAY NOTES NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000,000
PURSUANT TO THE INFORMAL BID PROCESS

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of **Hamblen County**, Tennessee, (the "Local Government") has determined that it is necessary and desirable to issue capital outlay notes in order to provide funds for the following public works project capping of Neblett Landfill Site and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that the Project will promote or provide a traditional governmental activity or otherwise fulfill a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Parts I, IV and VI of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act"), local governments in Tennessee are authorized to finance the cost of this Project through the issuance and sale of interest-bearing capital outlay notes upon the approval of the State Director of Local Finance; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body finds that it is advantageous to the Local Government to authorize the issuance of Title 9 Chapter 21 Section 608 capital outlay notes to finance the cost of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body as follows:

Section 1. That, for the purpose of providing funds to finance the cost of the Project in and for the Local Government, the Chief Executive Officer of the Local Government is hereby authorized in accordance with the terms of this resolution, and upon approval of the State Director of Local Finance, to issue and sell interest bearing capital outlay notes in a principal amount not to exceed 1 MILLION Dollars (\$1,000,000) (the "Notes") by an informal bid process pursuant to the terms, provisions, and conditions permitted by law. The Notes shall be designated "Neblett Landfill Site Capital Outlay Notes, Series 2005"; shall be numbered serially from 1 upwards; shall be dated as of the date of issuance; shall be in denomination(s) as agreed upon with the purchaser; shall be sold at not less than 99% of par value and accrued interest; and shall bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, and in no event shall the rate exceed the legal limit provided by law.

Section 2. That, the Notes shall mature not later than twelve (12) years after the date of issuance and, unless otherwise approved by the State Director of Local Finance, the Notes shall be amortized in an amount reflecting 2 at least level debt service on the Notes approximately according to the following schedule:

The Notes shall not exceed the reasonably expected economic life of the Project, which is hereby estimated to be at least 40 years.

Section 3. That, the Notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of the Local Government, in whole or in part, at any time, at the principal amount and accrued interest to the date of redemption, without a premium, or, if sold at par, with or without a premium of not exceeding one percent (1%) of the principal amount.

Section 4. That, the Notes shall be direct general obligations of the Local Government, for which the punctual payment of the principal and interest on the notes, the full faith and credit of the Local Government is irrevocably pledged and the Local Government hereby pledges its taxing power as to all taxable property in the Local Government for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes. The Governing Body of the Local Government hereby authorizes the levy and collection of a special tax on all taxable property of the Local Government over and above all other taxes authorized by the Local Government to create a sinking fund to retire the Notes with interest as they mature in an amount necessary for that purpose.

Section 5. That, the Notes shall be executed in the name of the Local Government; shall bear the manual signature of the chief executive officer of the Local Government and the manual signature of the county clerk, city recorder or other similar local government official as authorized by the governing body together with the Local Government seal affixed thereon; and shall be payable as to principal and interest at the office of the local government official as authorized by the Local Government or at the office of the paying agent duly appointed by the Local Government. Proceeds of the Notes shall be deposited with the county trustee, in the case of counties, or, in the case of municipalities or metropolitan governments, with the official designated by law as custodian of the funds. All proceeds shall be paid out for the purpose of financing the Project pursuant to this Resolution and as required by law.

Section 6. That, the Notes will be issued in fully registered form and that at all times during which any Note remains outstanding and unpaid, the Local Government or its agent shall keep or cause to be kept at its office a note register for the registration, exchange or transfer of the Notes. The note register, if held by an agent of the Local Government, shall at all times be open for inspection by the Local Government or any duly authorized officer of the Local Government. Each Note shall have the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument and shall be transferable only upon the note register kept by the Local Government or its agent, by the registered owner of the Note in person or by the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon presentation and surrender to the Local Government or its agent together with a written instrument or transfer satisfactory to the Local Government duly executed by the registered owner or the registered owner's duly authorized attorney. Upon the transfer of any such Note, the Local Government shall issue in the name of the transferee a new registered note or notes of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity as the surrendered Notes. The Local Government shall not be obligated to make any such Note transfer during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date on the Notes or, in the case of any redemption of the Notes, during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date of redemption.

Section 7. That, the Notes shall be in substantially the form authorized by the State Director of Local Finance and shall recite that the Notes are issued pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated.

Section 8. That, prior to the sale of the Notes, the Local Government shall submit a copy of this resolution authorizing the Notes to the State Director of the Local Finance for approval and a copy of the proposed disclosure statement, if any, and a statement showing the estimated annual principal and interest requirements for the Notes and a detailed statement showing the estimated cost of issuance which shall include at least the following, if applicable: (1) fiscal agent and/or financial advisor fees; (2) bond counsel fees; (3) other legal charges if any; (4) credit enhancement fees; (5) trustee fees; (6) registration fees; (7) paying agent fees; (8) rating agency fees; (9) underwriters' discount or charges; (10) remarketing agent fees; (11) printing, advertising and other expenses; (12) the number of financial institutions contacted by telephone or by letter (which should be at least three if possible) for the purpose of obtaining interest rates, and if only one institution was contacted a statement as to why only one institution was contacted. In its request for approval, the Local Government shall state and demonstrate that the proposed sale by the informal bid process is feasible, in the best interest of the Local Government, and that the Local Government should be able to amortize the proposed indebtedness together with all the obligations then outstanding.

Section 9. The Notes shall not be sold until receipt of the State Director of Local Finance's written approval for the sale of the Notes.

Section 10. That, the notes are hereby designated as qualified tax-exempt obligations for purpose of Section 265(b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

Section 11. That, after the sale of the Notes, and for each year that any of the notes are outstanding, the Local Government shall prepare an annual budget in a form consistent with accepted governmental standards and as approved by the State Director of Local Finance (the "Director".) The budget shall be kept balanced during the life of the notes. The annual budget shall be submitted to the Director immediately upon its adoption; however, it shall not become the official budget for the fiscal year until such budget is approved by the Director in accordance with Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Statutes".) If the Director determines that the budget does not comply with the Statutes, the Governing Body shall adjust its estimates or make additional tax levies sufficient to comply with the Statutes, or as directed by the Director.

Section 12. That, if any of the Notes shall remain unpaid at the end of twelve (12) years from the issue date, then the unpaid Notes shall be retired from the funds of the Local Government or be converted into bonds pursuant to Chapter 11 of Title 9 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, or any other law, or be otherwise liquidated as approval by the State Director of Local Finance.

Section 13. That, all orders or resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed insofar as such conflict exists; and this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

REQUESTING THAT THE CITY OF MORRISTOWN CHARGE THE LOWER CITY SEWER RATE TO THOSE SEWER CUSTOMERS WHO RESIDE IN HAMBLEN COUNTY AND WHO ARE CONNECTED TO THE CITY SEWER AS A RESULT OF A HAMBLEN COUNTY/STATE OF TENNESSEE GRANT

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Legislative Body has in the past secured Community Development Block Grant funding for sewer improvements in Hamblen County and currently has an application in process for a sewer grant in Whitesburg, and

WHEREAS, these grants are funded by federal and/or state monies combined with a local funding match from Hamblen County, and

WHEREAS, these grants for sewer improvements are provided primarily for low-income residents of Hamblen County, and

WHEREAS, in undertaking sewer improvements through a grant to Hamblen County, construction of the sewer improvements is paid by and through Hamblen County and, at completion, these improvements are signed over or gifted to the City of Morristown, thereby benefiting the City by eliminating any capital investment on its part, and

WHEREAS, the City of Morristown charges one sewer rate to residents living within the City limits and another higher rate that is almost twice the city rate to sewer customers who live outside the City limits, and

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Legislative Body is particularly concerned that these higher sewer rates are charged to county residents where the monies used to construct and extend the city sewer have come from a county-state/federal grant and are intended for low-income residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hamblen County Legislative Body, meeting in regular session on this the 21st day of July 2005, hereby requests that the City of Morristown use the lower city rate in billing those county residents who are connected to the sewer in those instances where the costs of construction and extension of the city sewer have been paid for through a grant secured by the county.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the county clerk of Hamblen County shall mail a certified copy of this Resolution to the Mayor of the City of Morristown and shall ask that the Mayor or City Administrator place this request on the agenda for the September 20th meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Morristown.
