(e) "Gross Subscriber Revenues" shall mean the revenues derived by the Company from the provision of its cable services (as such term is defined in the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, as amended) in the County, provided that the following revenues shall be excluded: advertising sales revenues, revenue from any other services that do not constitute cable service under federal law, franchise fees, any governmental or quasi-governmental taxes, fees or other assessments or credits, refunds, or deposits made to Subscribers or unrecovered bad debt.

SECTION 2: Both parties hereto recognize and ratify the definition set forth in Section 1 hereof retroactively to the effective date of the Franchise.

RESOLUTION BY HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE TO AMEND THE HAMBLEN COUNTY GOVERNMENTAL PERSONNEL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL

whereas, under Tennessee law, the Hamblen County legislative body has no statutory authority to establish uniform courthouse hours and require the County officials to remain open or closed during such scheduled hours; and

WHEREAS, under Tennessee law, each elected official has the authority to determine what hours his or her office shall be open or closed; and

whereas, various Hamblen County offices and departments operate on different hours ranging from 35 hours to 40 hours and, in addition, Hamblen County has some full-time employees who work 30 hours per week on a regular basis; and

WHEREAS, as a result of these differences, inequities have resulted in the way and in how benefits, namely holiday, vacation and sick leave are computed; and

WHEREAS, in an attempt to eliminate the inequities of the current system and to develop a fair method of computing benefits paid by Hamblen County to its employees, the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners desires to amend the current Hamblen County Government Personnel Policies and Procedures to accomplish those ends;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session on the 23^{rd} day of June, 2005, that the following amendments (as underlined herein) be made to the following Sections of the Hamblen County Government Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual:

That Section 2.0 Pay Plan, page 12 of the Policies and Procedures Manual be amended as follows:

Holiday Pay - Regular, full-time employees who are required to work on an official holiday shall receive holiday pay (regular straight time) in addition to receiving time and a half for hours actually worked on the holiday.

Hamblen County Departments have the liberty of setting their respective hours of operation. The hours of holiday pay accrued by an employee is determined by the actual hours the employee is regularly scheduled to work. For example, if an employee is regularly scheduled to work a 35 hour workweek, the employee would receive seven (7) hours of pay (35 hours divided by five days) for one day of holiday.

With respect to vacation leave, Section IV, Employee Benefits, Section 1.0, page 22 of the Manual, the following language is hereby added as the $4^{\rm th}$ paragraph immediately prior to "Accumulation of Vacation Time":

Vacation Time Accrual Rate - Hamblen County departments have the liberty of setting their respective hours of operation. Some departments and employees maintain less than a 40 hour workweek. For eligible employees, vacation time accrued is determined by the actual hours an employee is regularly scheduled to work. For example, if an employee is regularly scheduled to work a 36 hour workweek, each week of vacation accrued by such employee is equal to 36 hours. Accordingly, one day of vacation time accrued or used is equal to 7.2 hours (36 hours divided by five days).

With respect to the County's sick leave policy, Section IV, Employee Benefits, Section 2.0, page 22 of the Manual, the following amendment is adopted:

Earnings and Accumulating Sick Days - Sick leave will be considered a benefit and a privilege and not a right. Full-time, regular employees will receive full pay during incapacity caused by illness if sick leave is taken. Sick leave is earned at the rate of one day per month (12 days per year). There are no maximum sick leave credits. Each sick day earned by an employee shall be equal to the employee's regular scheduled hours of employment. For example, if an employee is regularly scheduled to work 38 hours per week, each earned sick day equals 7.6 hours (38 hours divided by five days). The employee shall not be paid for accumulated sick leave credit days, but shall be able to count the unused sick leave credit days toward their retirement (to the extent allowed under the rules and regulations under the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System). The Elected Official or Department Head may require an employee that is sick to furnish his or her Employer with a doctor's certificate, certifying they were unable to work.

With respect to bereavement leave, Section IV, Employee Benefits, Section 3.0, page 23 of the Manual, the following amendment is adopted:

In case of death in the employee's immediate family, the employee will be given three (3) days paid leave which will not be charged to vacation leave. Employee shall receive his or her regular compensation based on his or her regular scheduled workday during bereavement leave.

With respect to the "Definitions" section, page 72, the following amendments are adopted:

Full-Time Regular Employees are those who are hired to work and do work the County's normal, full-time workweek on a regular basis. These employees may be "exempt" or "non-exempt" as defined below. These employees are eligible for employee benefits. For purposes of this definition, a full-time regular employee is determined by the number of hours worked and not by any designation contained in any decree or judgment establishing positions within the offices of Elected Officials or Department Heads as defined herein. The term "regular" as used herein shall mean consistently averaging 30 hours or more per week. For purposes of calculating accrued time for vacation leave, sick leave, holiday pay, and benefits, employees working 30 hours or more, but less than full-time, are considered full-time regular employees.

With respect to the "Benefits" definition, page 73, the following amendment is adopted:

Benefits, for purposes of full-time regular employees, means matching social security, medical insurance, participation in the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System, term life insurance, payment for recognized holidays, sick leave as defined herein, the accrual of vacation time and worker's compensation. Part-time regular employees and temporary employees are not entitled to Benefits.

TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, SALE, AND PAYMENT OF GENERAL FUND TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES NOT TO EXCEED 2,000,000.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Hamblen, Tennessee, (the "Local Government") has determined that it is necessary and desirable to borrow a limited amount of funds to meet appropriations made for the General Fund (the "Fund") for the current fiscal year, being July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006, inclusive, (the "Fiscal Year"), in anticipation of the collection of taxes and revenues for the Fund during the Fiscal Year; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Part I, IV, and VIII of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act"), local governments in Tennessee are authorized to issue and sell interest-bearing tax anticipation notes in amounts not exceeding sixty percent (60%) of the Fund appropriation for the Fiscal Year upon the approval of the State Director of Local Finance; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body finds that it is advantageous to the Local Government to authorize the issuance and sale of tax anticipation notes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of Hamblen County, Tennessee, as follows:

Section 1. Section 2. That, the sum of the principal amount of the Notes, together with the principal amount or amounts of any prior tax anticipation notes issued during the Fiscal Year, does not exceed sixty percent (60%) of the Fund appropriation for the Fiscal Year.

Section 3. That, the Notes may be renewed from time to time and money may be borrowed from time to time for the payment of any indebtedness evidenced by the Notes; provided, that the Notes and any renewal notes shall mature and be paid in full without renewal on or before the end of the Fiscal Year. If the Local Government overestimates the amount of taxes and revenue collected for the Fiscal Year and it becomes impossible to retire the Notes and all renewal notes prior to the close of the Fiscal Year, then the Local Government shall apply to the State Director of Local Finance within ten (10) days prior to the close of the Fiscal year for permission to issue funding bonds to cover the unpaid Notes in the manner provided by Title 9, Chapter 11 of Tennessee Code Annotated or as otherwise provided for in a manner approved by the State Director of Local Finance.

Section 4. That, the Notes shall be secured solely by the receipt of taxes and revenues by the Fund during the Fiscal Year.

Section 5. That, the Notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of the Local government, in whole or in part, at any time, at the principal amount and accrued interest to the date of redemption without a premium.

Section 6. That, the Notes shall be executed in the name of the Local Government and bear the manual signature of the chief executive officer of the Local Government and the manual signature of the David W. Purkey, County Mayor and Linda Wilder, County Clerk with the Local Government seal affixed thereon; and shall be payable as to principal and interest at the office of the County Mayor of the Local Government or the paying agent duly appointed by the Local Government. Proceeds of the Notes shall be deposited with the Trustee of the Local Government and shall be paid out for the purpose of meeting Fund appropriations made for the Fiscal Year in anticipation of the collection of revenues and taxes pursuant to this Resolution and as required by law.
