RESOLUTION //-2/-0/ TO OPPOSE SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 1 RELATIVE TO PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

WHEREAS, in 2004, Senate Joint Resolution 1 was introduced to propose an amendment to Article II, Section 28, of the Constitution of the State of Tennessee, to authorize a new method of property tax relief for senior citizens in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the program proposed by Senate Joint Resolution 1 would freeze property taxes for elderly taxpayers at the rate paid when the program is enacted or when the taxpayer turns sixty-five years of age; and

WHEREAS, the language of Senate Joint Resolution 1 provides little detail with regard to the parameters of the program which would be established by the General Assembly in the future; and

WHEREAS, the program would be authorized and paid for by local governments, but control of the specifics of the program would rest with the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, if the program described in Senate Joint Resolution 1 is authorized, there would be substantial political pressure for local governments to establish such programs which would then be under the discretion and control of the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, a program for low income elderly property tax relief is already authorized under state law pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-5-701, et seq. and provides a significant level of relief to needy taxpayers.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of fourty, meeting in <u>resolut</u> session on this <u>1</u> day of <u>Nov.</u>, 200<u>5</u>, that the Tennessee General Assembly is strongly urged to defeat Senate Joint Resolution 1 and to reject similar legislative proposals which would have the effect of authorizing local property tax relief programs where the parameters and conditions of such programs are outside the control of the local government adopting such program.

RESOLUTION //-21-02 TO URGE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO CONSIDER LEGISLATION RELATIVE TO EMINENT DOMAIN

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2005, the United States Supreme Court reached its decision in the case of Suzette Kelo, et al. v. City of New London, et al., upholding the use of condemnation powers by a Connecticut municipality to seize residential property for an economic development project; and

WHEREAS, the 5-4 decision of the Supreme Court expanded the understanding of what constitutes a "public use" relative to the exercise of eminent domain authority by a local government and has sparked a firestorm of objections from representatives at all levels of government as well as from advocacy groups and citizens; and

WHEREAS, legislation has been filed at both the state and federal level in response to the Kelo v. New London decision to limit abusive uses of eminent domain; and

WHEREAS, county governments in Tennessee have heard a clear message from Tennessee citizens that they are concerned about abusive uses of local government condemnation authority:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Handler County, meeting in regular session on this 21 day of Nov., 2005, that:

- 1) The Board of County Commissioners of However County opposes the exercise of eminent domain or condemnation powers by a local government for the sole or primary benefit of private parties.
- The Board of County Commissioners of Herber County finds that eminent domain powers should be used as a last resort and should be limited to the acquisition of property for county purposes. The only circumstance where condemned property could be sold or transferred at a later date to a private entity would be in the context of redevelopment of blighted areas.
- 3) The Board of County Commissioners of Assembly to thoughtfully consider issues relative to the use of eminent domain by local governments in Tennessee and to enact legislation to protect private property owners in Tennessee from abusive use of eminent domain.

AMENDED AND ADDITIONAL DEFINITIONS

"Junkyard" shall mean an establishment, a place of business and/or a parcel of real estate which is maintained, operated, or used for storing, keeping, buying or selling junk, or salvage, or for the maintenance or operation of an automobile wrecking yard. "Junkyard" includes scrap metal processors, car crushing sites, used auto parts yards, yards providing temporary storage of automobile bodies or parts awaiting disposal as a normal part of the business operation, when the business will continually have like materials located on the premises, garbage dumps and sanitary landfills. For purposes of this resolution, a "recycling center" shall not be a "junkyard."

"Junk" or "salvage" shall mean old or scrap copper, brass, rope, rags, batteries, paper, trash, rubber, debris, waste, or junked, dismantled, wrecked or inoperable automobiles, or parts thereof, salvage, iron, steel, and other old or scrap ferrous or nonferrous metals.

"Automobile wrecking yard" shall mean any lot or place which is exposed to the weather and upon which more than five (5) inoperable motor vehicles of any kind, or parts thereof, or which it would not be economically practical to make operative, are placed, located or found. For purposes of this definition, any landowner owning more than one adjoining lots or parcels shall be considered the owner of one (1) tract of land. "Automobile wrecking yard" shall not be construed to mean an establishment having facilities for processing iron, steel, or nonferrous scrap and whose principal product is scrap iron, steel, or nonferrous scrap for sale or remelting purposes only, nor shall such definition include a body shop or towing service licensed to conduct business in Hamblen County.

"Inoperable motor vehicle" shall be defined as any vehicle, car, truck, van, bus, recreational vehicle, motorcycle, or parts thereof, which does not have an engine or drive train in operating condition, inflated tires on all wheels, an operative battery, or valid state license plate and registration issued to a person in possession of the property on which the vehicle is located, or which, for any reason, is not operable and capable of being legally driven upon the roads and highways of the County and the State of Tennessee under its own power.

"Recycling center" means an establishment, place of business, facility or building which is maintained, operated or used for the storing, keeping, buying or selling of newspaper, paper products or glass or plastic used for food or beverage containers for the purpose of converting such items into a usable product.

- 7.4 DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS FOR AUTOMOBILE WRECKING, JUNK AND SALVAGE YARDS, AND DUMPS. Because of the nature and character of their operations, automobile wrecking and salvage yards, junkyards, and similar uses of land can have a decidedly detrimental effect upon surrounding properties. Salvage and wrecking yards tend to create problems of noise, dust, traffic and health hazards and may adversely affect property values by their general appearance. The following standards shall be used as a guide in evaluating whether proposed land uses, such as those outlined above, will have properly minimized their objectionable characteristics:
- A. All motor vehicles stored or kept in such yards shall be so kept that they will not catch or hold water in which mosquitoes may breed or so that they will not constitute a place or places in which rats, mice, or other vermin may be harbored, reared, or propagated.
- B. Because of the tendency for salvage yards, junkyard or automobile wrecking yards to promote the breeding of vermin, no such operation shall be permitted closer than five hundred (500) feet from any established residence.
- C. All automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards located on a county road shall be conducted entirely within either an enclosed opaque fence, screen, or wall, excepting driveway areas, from eight (8) feet to twelve (12) feet in height or a screen or wall composed of white pines, eastern hemlocks, scotch pines or Leland cypress trees, no less than four feet in height at planting, at 20' intervals between tree trucks along the fence lines, excepting driveway areas. Any fence, screen or wall for screening purposes shall be properly painted or otherwise maintained in good condition. Variances may be granted by the Board of Zoning Appeals where traffic safety is an issue.
- D. All such yards shall be so maintained as to be in a sanitary condition and so as not to be a menace to the public health or safety.
- E. <u>OFF-ROAD PARKING</u>. No vehicles may be parked outside of the fence, screen, or wall.
- F. <u>INGRESS AND EGRESS</u>. The number of vehicular access driveways permitted on any single street frontage shall be limited to:
 - 1. One (1) driveway where the parcel to be used has a maximum road or street frontage of one hundred (100) feet or less.
 - 2. Two (2) driveways where the road or street frontage exceeds one hundred (100) feet.
- G. Except for grandfathered, nonconforming yards, no automobile wrecking, junkyard or salvage yards shall be permitted within three hundred (300) feet of any public road in Hamblen County.
- H. APPLICATION FOR AUTOMOBILE WRECKING, JUNK, OR SALVAGE YARD PERMIT.

 No person shall own or maintain an automobile wrecking, junkyard, or salvage yard within Hamblen County until he has secured a permit from the Hamblen County Board of Zoning Appeals. An application for said permit shall be filed and shall be accompanied by a detailed Site Plan, a schedule for construction, and any other information herein required.

- I. <u>DUMPS</u>. No person shall own or maintain a landfill or waste dump within Hamblen County until a Site Plan has been submitted and approved by the Planning Commission; received approval as a special exception by the Board of Zoning Appeals; and received a permit issued by the Tennessee Department of Health and Environment, Division of Solid Waste. No such landfill or dump shall be permitted within five hundred (500) feet of a residence, school, church, park, or public gathering place. All debris must be covered daily from public view. The dumping of chemicals or toxins is not permitted. Other standards required for junkyards shall also be required for dumps.
- J. <u>SAVINGS CLAUSE</u>. If any of the provisions of this Article 7.4 conflict with the provisions of general law regarding the regulation of junkyards, by being less restrictive than the general law or otherwise, then the general law provisions shall govern the matter at issue.
- K. <u>AMORTIZATION SCHEDULE</u>. With respect to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F., any non-conforming junkyard considered "grandfathered" under this Resolution or general law shall lose such grandfathered status with regard to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F. three (3) years after the adoption of this amended Article 7.4.

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ZONING AMENDMENT

10.6 <u>Penalties</u>. It shall be unlawful to erect, construct, reconstruct, alter, maintain or use any building or structure or to use any land in violation of any of the provisions of this Resolution or any Amendment thereof enacted or adopted by the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners. A violation of this part shall constitute a Class C Misdemeanor. Each and every day during which such illegal erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, maintenance or use continues is deemed a separate offense. In addition, Hamblen County shall also have the authority to enforce this Resolution by any and all measures permitted by *Tennessee Code Annotated* §§ 5-1-121 and/or 13-7-111.

- 1. UPPC will perform a post mortem examination and issue a report on each case referred to UPPC by County for a fee, per case, of Thirteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,300). This fee shall include the usual supplies, laboratory and pathology doctor's charges, in addition to subsequent testimony. This fee shall include receipt and storage of the body. In the event there are unusual supplies, laboratory or pathology doctor's charges, County will be notified in advance for approval. No additional charges will be incurred without County prior approval.
- County shall be responsible for all charges regarding the transportation of the body to and
 from the UPPC Regional Forensic Center facilities in Knoxville, Tennessee. UPPC shall
 invoice Hamblen County for its charges after it has completed its examination and issued
 its report.
- 3. The charges shall be paid by County within thirty (30) days of the receipt of said invoice.

- 4. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. This Agreement will remain valid and in effect until such time as written notice to terminate is issued by one party to the other.
- 5. County and UPPC shall have no liability except as specifically provided herein.

RESOLUTION //-2-/-O/ TO OPPOSE SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 1 RELATIVE TO PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

WHEREAS, in 2004, Senate Joint Resolution 1 was introduced to propose an amendment to Article II, Section 28, of the Constitution of the State of Tennessee, to authorize a new method of property tax relief for senior citizens in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the program proposed by Senate Joint Resolution 1 would freeze property taxes for elderly taxpayers at the rate paid when the program is enacted or when the taxpayer turns sixty-five years of age; and

WHEREAS, the language of Senate Joint Resolution 1 provides little detail with regard to the parameters of the program which would be established by the General Assembly in the future; and

WHEREAS, the program would be authorized and paid for by local governments, but control of the specifics of the program would rest with the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, if the program described in Senate Joint Resolution 1 is authorized, there would be substantial political pressure for local governments to establish such programs which would then be under the discretion and control of the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, a program for low income elderly property tax relief is already authorized under state law pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-5-701, et seq. and provides a significant level of relief to needy taxpayers.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of fourty, meeting in regular session on this H day of Nov., 2005, that the Tennessee General Assembly is strongly urged to defeat Senate Joint Resolution 1 and to reject similar legislative proposals which would have the effect of authorizing local property tax relief programs where the parameters and conditions of such programs are outside the control of the local government adopting such program.

RESOLUTION //-21-02 TO URGE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO CONSIDER LEGISLATION RELATIVE TO EMINENT DOMAIN

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2005, the United States Supreme Court reached its decision in the case of Suzette Kelo, et al. v. City of New London, et al., upholding the use of condemnation powers by a Connecticut municipality to seize residential property for an economic development project; and

WHEREAS, the 5-4 decision of the Supreme Court expanded the understanding of what constitutes a "public use" relative to the exercise of eminent domain authority by a local government and has sparked a firestorm of objections from representatives at all levels of government as well as from advocacy groups and citizens; and

WHEREAS, legislation has been filed at both the state and federal level in response to the Kelo v. New London decision to limit abusive uses of eminent domain; and

WHEREAS, county governments in Tennessee have heard a clear message from Tennessee citizens that they are concerned about abusive uses of local government condemnation authority:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hander County, meeting in regular session on this 11 day of Nov., 2005, that:

- 1) The Board of County Commissioners of Hernder-County opposes the exercise of eminent domain or condemnation powers by a local government for the sole or primary benefit of private parties.
- The Board of County Commissioners of <u>Harder</u> County finds that eminent domain powers should be used as a last resort and should be limited to the acquisition of property for county purposes. The only circumstance where condemned property could be sold or transferred at a later date to a private entity would be in the context of redevelopment of blighted areas.
- 3) The Board of County Commissioners of Lower County urges the Tennessee General Assembly to thoughtfully consider issues relative to the use of eminent domain by local governments in Tennessee and to enact legislation to protect private property owners in Tennessee from abusive use of eminent domain.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the county clerk shall mail certified copies of this resolution to the members of the Tennessee General Assembly representing the people of Hamber County.

"Junkyard" shall mean an establishment, a place of business and/or a parcel of real estate which is maintained, operated, or used for storing, keeping, buying or selling junk, or salvage, or for the maintenance or operation of an automobile wrecking yard. "Junkyard" includes scrap metal processors, car crushing sites, used auto parts yards, yards providing temporary storage of automobile bodies or parts awaiting disposal as a normal part of the business operation, when the business will continually have like materials located on the premises, garbage dumps and sanitary landfills. For purposes of this resolution, a "recycling center" shall not be a "junkyard."

"Junk" or "salvage" shall mean old or scrap copper, brass, rope, rags, batteries, paper, trash, rubber, debris, waste, or junked, dismantled, wrecked or inoperable automobiles, or parts thereof, salvage, iron, steel, and other old or scrap ferrous or nonferrous metals.

"Automobile wrecking yard" shall mean any lot or place which is exposed to the weather and upon which more than five (5) inoperable motor vehicles of any kind, or parts thereof, or which it would not be economically practical to make operative, are placed, located or found. For purposes of this definition, any landowner owning more than one adjoining lots or parcels shall be considered the owner of one (1) tract of land. "Automobile wrecking yard" shall not be construed to mean an establishment having facilities for processing iron, steel, or nonferrous scrap and whose principal product is scrap iron, steel, or nonferrous scrap for sale or remelting purposes only; nor shall such definition include a body shop or towing service licensed to conduct business in Hamblen County.

"Inoperable motor vehicle" shall be defined as any vehicle, car, truck, van, bus, recreational vehicle, motorcycle, or parts thereof, which does not have an engine or drive train in operating condition, inflated tires on all wheels, an operative battery, or valid state license plate and registration issued to a person in possession of the property on which the vehicle is located, or which, for any reason, is not operable and capable of being legally driven upon the roads and highways of the County and the State of Tennessee under its own power.

"Recycling center" means an establishment, place of business, facility or building which is maintained, operated or used for the storing, keeping, buying or selling of newspaper, paper products or glass or plastic used for food or beverage containers for the purpose of converting such items into a usable product.

- 7.4 DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS FOR AUTOMOBILE WRECKING, JUNK AND SALVAGE YARDS, AND DUMPS. Because of the nature and character of their operations, automobile wrecking and salvage yards, junkyards, and similar uses of land can have a decidedly detrimental effect upon surrounding properties. Salvage and wrecking yards tend to create problems of noise, dust, traffic and health hazards and may adversely affect property values by their general appearance. The following standards shall be used as a guide in evaluating whether proposed land uses, such as those outlined above, will have properly minimized their objectionable characteristics:
- A. All motor vehicles stored or kept in such yards shall be so kept that they will not catch or hold water in which mosquitoes may breed or so that they will not constitute a place or places in which rats, mice, or other vermin may be harbored, reared, or propagated.
- B. Because of the tendency for salvage yards, junkyard or automobile wrecking yards to promote the breeding of vermin, no such operation shall be permitted closer than five hundred (500) feet from any established residence.
- C. All automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards located on a county road shall be conducted entirely within either an enclosed opaque fence, screen, or wall, excepting driveway areas, from eight (8) feet to twelve (12) feet in height or a screen or wall composed of white pines, eastern hemlocks, scotch pines or Leland cypress trees, no less than four feet in height at planting, at 20' intervals between tree trucks along the fence lines, excepting driveway areas. Any fence, screen or wall for screening purposes shall be properly painted or otherwise maintained in good condition. Variances may be granted by the Board of Zoning Appeals where traffic safety is an issue.
- D. All such yards shall be so maintained as to be in a sanitary condition and so as not to be a menace to the public health or safety.
- E. OFF-ROAD PARKING. No vehicles may be parked outside of the fence, screen, or wall.
- F. <u>INGRESS AND EGRESS</u>. The number of vehicular access driveways permitted on any single street frontage shall be limited to:
 - 1. One (1) driveway where the parcel to be used has a maximum road or street frontage of one hundred (100) feet or less.
 - 2. Two (2) driveways where the road or street frontage exceeds one hundred (100) feet.
- G. Except for grandfathered, nonconforming yards, no automobile wrecking, junkyard or salvage yards shall be permitted within three hundred (300) feet of any public road in Hamblen County.
- H. APPLICATION FOR AUTOMOBILE WRECKING, JUNK, OR SALVAGE YARD PERMIT.

 No person shall own or maintain an automobile wrecking, junkyard, or salvage yard within Hamblen County until he has secured a permit from the Hamblen County Board of Zoning Appeals. An application for said permit shall be filed and shall be accompanied by a detailed Site Plan, a schedule for construction, and any other information herein required!

- I. <u>DUMPS</u>. No person shall own or maintain a landfill or waste dump within Hamblen County until a Site Plan has been submitted and approved by the Planning Commission; received approval as a special exception by the Board of Zoning Appeals; and received a permit issued by the Tennessee Department of Health and Environment, Division of Solid Waste. No such landfill or dump shall be permitted within five hundred (500) feet of a residence, school, church, park, or public gathering place. All debris must be covered daily from public view. The dumping of chemicals or toxins is not permitted. Other standards required for junkyards shall also be required for dumps.
- J. <u>SAVINGS CLAUSE</u>. If any of the provisions of this Article 7.4 conflict with the provisions of general law regarding the regulation of junkyards, by being less restrictive than the general law or otherwise, then the general law provisions shall govern the matter at issue.
- K. AMORTIZATION SCHEDULE. With respect to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F., any non-conforming junkyard considered "grandfathered" under this Resolution or general law shall lose such grandfathered status with regard to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F. three (3) years after the adoption of this amended Article 7.4.

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ZONING AMENDMENT

10.6 <u>Penalties</u>. It shall be unlawful to erect, construct, reconstruct, alter, maintain or use any building or structure or to use any land in violation of any of the provisions of this Resolution or any Amendment thereof enacted or adopted by the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners. A violation of this part shall constitute a Class C Misdemeanor. Each and every day during which such illegal erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, maintenance or use continues is deemed a separate offense. In addition, Hamblen County shall also have the authority to enforce this Resolution by any and all measures permitted by Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 5-1-121 and/or 13-7-111.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE

UNIVERSITY PATHOLOGISTS, PC

between Hamblen County, Tennessee (hereinafter referre	ed to as "County"),	, and University
Pathologists, P.C., (hereinafter referred to as "UPPC").		

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, County wishes to retain UPPC to perform post mortem examinations; and WHEREAS, UPPC is willing to perform said post mortem examinations for County; NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. UPPC will perform a post mortem examination and issue a report on each case referred to UPPC by County for a fee, per case, of Thirteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,300). This fee shall include the usual supplies, laboratory and pathology doctor's charges, in addition to subsequent testimony. This fee shall include receipt and storage of the body. In the event there are unusual supplies, laboratory or pathology doctor's charges, County will be notified in advance for approval. No additional charges will be incurred without County prior approval.
- County shall be responsible for all charges regarding the transportation of the body to and
 from the UPPC Regional Forensic Center facilities in Knoxville, Tennessee. UPPC shall
 invoice Hamblen County for its charges after it has completed its examination and issued
 its report.
- 3. The charges shall be paid by County within thirty (30) days of the receipt of said invoice.

- 4. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. This Agreement will remain valid and in effect until such time as written notice to terminate is issued by one party to the other.
- 5. County and UPPC shall have no liability except as specifically provided herein.
